

# Applying for 504 Accommodations at SHS

## WHO SHOULD APPLY FOR 504 ACCOMMODATIONS?

Any student who has a diagnosed medical, behavioral, emotional, learning, or physical disability qualifies for 504 accommodations.

The following conditions are some that commonly receive accommodations at school:

**Medical:** diabetes, hearing loss, visual impairment, multiple sclerosis, fibromyalgia, migraines, Crohns disease, cancer, leukemia and more.

**Behavioral:** ADHD, autism, and more.

**Emotional:** depression, anxiety, panic attacks, bipolar disorder, borderline personality disorder, schizophrenia, anorexia, bulimia, and more.

**Learning:** dyslexia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia, processing disorder, mixed receptive-expressive language disorder and more.

**Physical:** cerebral palsy or broken bones (that impede walking or writing), and more.

*This is by no means an exhaustive list. Please contact the Student Services Counselor if you feel that your student has a condition that needs 504 accommodations.*

## The 504 Process at SHS:

- 1) Contact the Student Services Counselor
- 2) Fill out a 504 Consent Form & Family History Form & return
- 3) Counselor's Secretary will contact you to set up a 504 meeting.

## INITIAL 504 MEETINGS

**Time:** Either 7:15am or 3:10pm

**Who attends:** student, parent, counselor & a teacher.

**Purpose:** To qualify the student's disability and decide on appropriate accommodations for the classroom.

## Documentation Needed for a 504 Meeting:

**504 Consent Form**

**Family Form**

**Doctor's Letter or Psychoeducational Testing to confirm diagnosis.**

## COMMON 504 ACCOMMODATIONS:

Extended Time for tests and quizzes, use of the testing center, copies of class notes provided, and preferential seating.

*Accommodations are decided on a case-by-case basis depending of individual student needs.*
